I was one of Cindy's kids - the one with the behavioral issues (which I eventually outgrew). I left

when I was 15 but to me, she's the only mom I've ever known, even if I never made it easy for her. I never met Ivan personally but felt like I got to know him via Mom's book. I noticed that she focused mostly on herself, Ivan, and Seneca, which I do understand since the story's about Ivan. But I do wish she included a few more stories of Ivan's interaction with Emily, Jordan, Sarah, and Kailey, together and separately. I do a lot of reading and (both published works and fanfiction websites) Mom might not have perfect grammer and whatnot but she's far from being one of the worse. The story is engaging and she stayed on topic. That's what matters, right?

This is a story told with grace, honesty, and respect for all. Cindy shares a sliver of her life while telling her relationship with a boy in need of love, care, and stability. We readers grow to understand that Cindy needed the boy as well; she makes it clear that she and her amazing family gained much from their all-too-brief time with Ivan. While most of us might not have the emotional or physical fortitude to undertake fostering medically or emotionally fragile children, we can relate to Cindy's feelings and experiences while raising an emotional teen-ager. I was inspired by Ivan's clarity in knowing how he wanted to confront his death; I was awed by Cindy's ability to support him throughout.

This book is so straight forward and so honest to the heart of a beautiful and agonizing experience. Cindy invites you to see the joy, challenges, desires and pain of someone who decides to let a another all the way into their lives. Fostering is a tremendous challenge but what Cindy and her family does is not fostering but embracing new family in a way we can all learn from. My heart is blessed and encouraged by reading this book.

I was the school psychologist and counselor for 26 years at the elementary school where Cindy's children attended school. Over those years, I worked with Cindy on many occasions and was honored to work with many of her children. I know many school staff who interacted with her during these years. There is really only one word that we could use to describe Cindy and her work. The word is "saint" and we don't use it lightly. Cindy is one of the most remarkable and exceptionally loving human beings I have had the privilege to know in my life.
