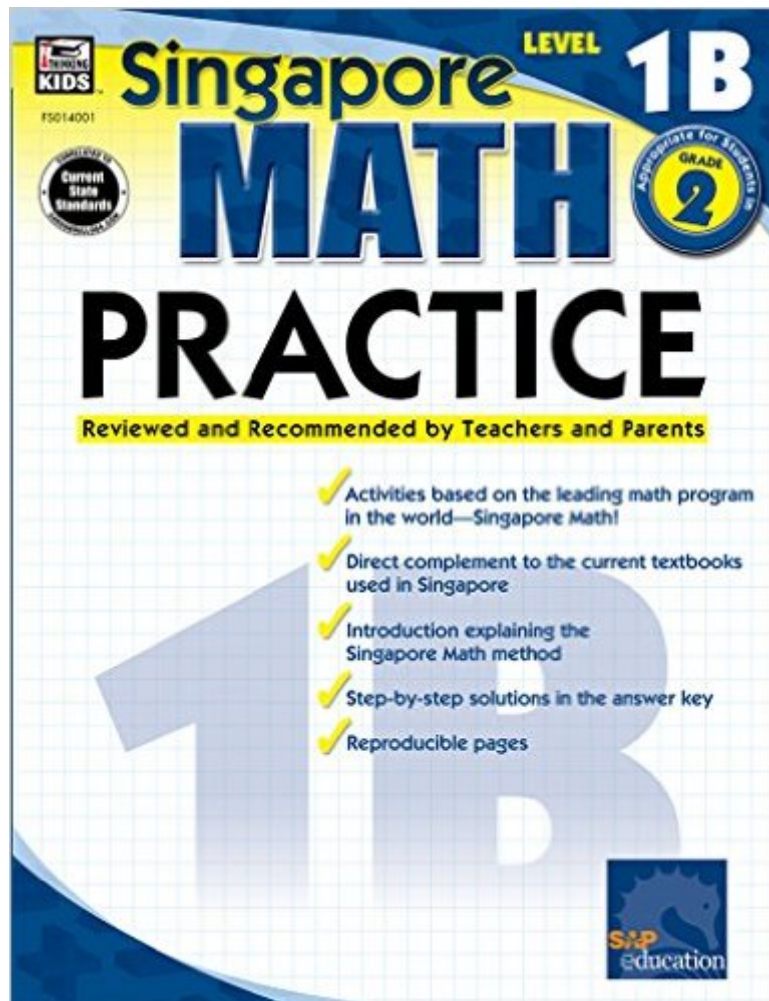

This practice book is great and goes right along side Singapore Math at the same level. You can skip parts that your child doesn't need extra review on or just move along right with the book,

completing each section with the curriculum. We are homeschoolers and love Singapore Math and it's practice books.

Loved this book and will buy the sequence as a supplement to the Singapore Math Curriculum. We have used both 1A and 1B and did all of the pages. My early learner has a great grasp on math. He thinks math is easy. When it comes to math, practice does make it perfect! We also are subscribers to IXL.com and love it.

My school adopted HM Singapore Math this year. A 2nd grade teacher bought this book thinking it would be for 2nd grade, since that is what's printed on the book cover. However, this follows the 1st grade curriculum, not 2nd. She gave the book to me since I teach 1st. I have found the book to be a good practice resource that very closely follows the Houghton Mifflin series.

My daughter needs math practice. She was not enjoying repetition at Kumon so I decided to start Singapore math. This is easier than her level (she is in 1st grade) but at least she is enjoying it. I am hoping that as we climb up the series, she will be more challenged and still continue to enjoy maths

I did like this book even though it is aligned with common core standards. It was challenging but not difficult for my 1st grader that I homeschool. I just don't like the extra steps that he has to take to find the answers.

Having worked for years with other Singapore Math series, I do not recommend this series at all. For one thing, it emphasizes using calculators, which is not the best practice for learning math. The problems are not well designed, and I found too many errors. If you are looking for supplementation in addition to the textbook and workbook, it might be useful. But if you are looking for a Singapore Math curriculum, as so many are, save your money here and buy the real thing from [singaporemath.com](http://singaporemath.com) or one of its competitors.

Overall this is a good series of books to learn math from a different perspective. These books are said to be designed for 2nd graders but the first book was way too easy for my son. Second book was a lot more challenging and he is having fun going through it. These, according to me, should be used as a supplemental tool to the math curriculum rather than teaching tool.

Purchased this book to reinforce what my son had learned at the end of 2nd grade (his school uses Singapore Math). It's what I was expecting, and there is an answer key at the end of the book. It shows how they expected the problems to be solved as well.

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
