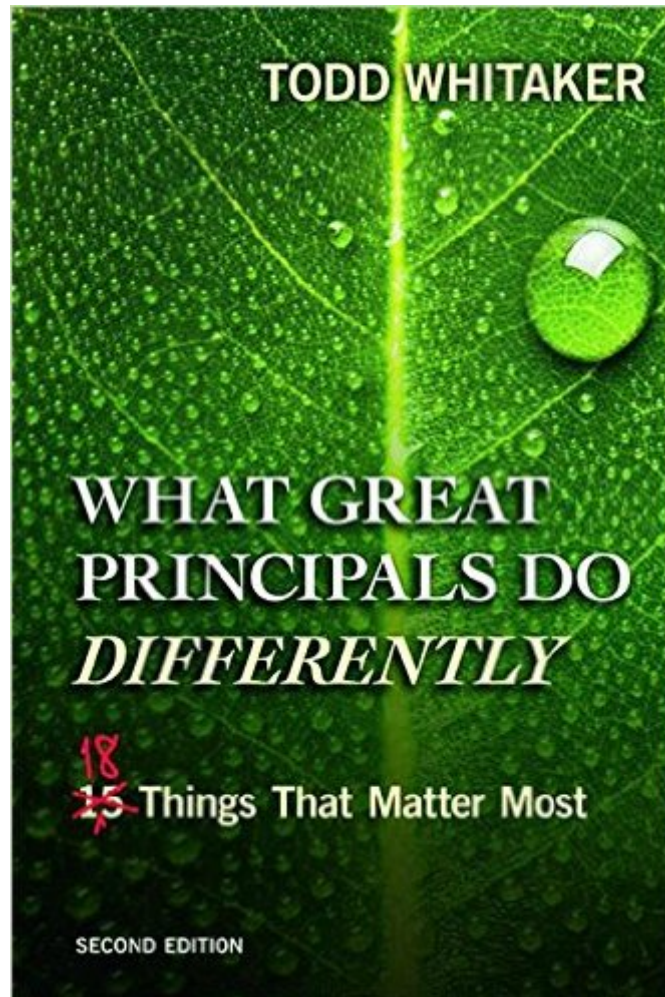

Todd echoed the leadership principles of one of my all-time favorite authors Napoleon Hill. I could hear a little Napoleon Hill in each session as Todd put the priority on people, collaboration, common sense, good judgment, what works and doing what's best for kids. To quote Todd Whitacker: "People, not programs determines quality." This book is hands-down the best book on school leadership I ever read in a quarter-century as a school administrator.
